***"The Liffey for naturalists"* by Christopher Moriarty**

Christopher Moriarty, a long-standing member of the Dublin Naturalist's Field Club spent his career as a biologist with various State fisheries agencies. His speciality was eels, of which he has written "*Eels: A Natural and Unnatural History*". Besides eels his interests extend widely. He has written several books which display his great knowledge and interest in natural history including his invaluable guide to the Dodder "*Down the Dodder: Wildlife,*

History, Legend Walks”, and his co-edited *The Book of the Liffey*, with Elizabeth Healy and Gerard O’Flaherty published by Wolfhound Press, to mark Dublin’s millennium.

In 2018 “*The River Liffey: History and Heritage*” by Christopher Moriarty was published.
